Action to be taken

Areas where there are potential negative impacts:

Disability: People who are visually impaired or with physical disabilities may require adaptive technology in order to make full use of ICT facilities. Ensure reading list software functions with screen reader software. Lists can be saved as PDF for use in such software, so it will be necessary to ensure library staff are aware of this functionality. Liaise with system vendor regarding any other problems identified. They confirm that text and images can be expanded up to 200% without distortion. Conforms to WC3's WCAG 2.1 AA guidelines, reaching AAA in some aspects. Works with OS accessibility tools: inverted colours, increased contrast and greyscale.

Maternity: Staff members on maternity may have missed the rollout of the new software. A module leader might have missed being assigned a list in the system. Ensure those on maternity leave have access to training materials/support when they return.
