Scottish Credit and Qualification Framework

The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework sets out the relationship between different qualifications, their equivalence and the progression routes between them. All programmes, including those awarded by SQA, are placed within the framework. Further details can be found at www.scqf.org.uk/

Quality Assurance Agency

The Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education has responsibility to review the quality and standards of the university. It does this by auditing the way in which the university manages the overall quality and standards of its provision through an enhancement-led institutional review (ELIR).

During 2015-16, the university successfully underwent an enhancement-led institutional review, in which QAA gave a judgement that the university 'has effective arrangements for managing academic standards and the student learning experience. These arrangements are likely to continue to be effective in the future.' This is a positive judgement, which means the university has robust arrangements for securing academic standards and for enhancing the quality of the student experience.

The next enhancement-led institutional review will be held during academic year 2020-21.

UK Quality Code for Higher Education

The UK Quality Code, published by QAA, provides guidance to higher education institutions on the 'expectations' that they are required to meet, which are the key matters of principle defined by the HE sector as important for the assurance of quality and academic standards. It includes the following chapters:

- A1: UK and European reference points for academic standards
- A2: Degree-awarding bodies' reference points for academic standards
- A3: Securing academic standards and an outcomes-based approach to academic awards

- B3: Learning and teaching
- B4: Enabling student development and achievement
- B5: Student engagement
- B6: Assessment of students and the recognition of prior learning

- B9: Academic appeals and student complaints
- B10: Managing higher education provision with others
- B11: Research degrees

Subject Benchmarks
