

MSc Algal Biotechnology and Bioeconomy Scholarships and Funding information

All places on this course are self-funded. SAMS and UHI do not provide scholarships, however you may be eligible for support from a range of institutions, as listed below.

UK/Home Students

- Student Awards Agency Scotland (SAAS): Eligible Scotland-domiciled students studying on a fulltime basis can access loans up to £10,000 from the Student Awards Agency Scotland (SAAS). This includes a tuition fee loan and a non-income assessed living cost loan. Full details of support can be found on the <u>SAAS</u> website.
- Student Finance England: UK nationals resident in England, or Irish citizens or EU citizens with
 settled status or indefinite leave to remain in the UK who normally reside in England, may be
 eligible for a Postgraduate Master's Loan of up to £11,500. This loan acts as a contribution
 towards tuition fees and living costs. Full details of support can be found on the Student Finance Master's Loan website and Prospects.
- Student Finance Wales: UK nationals resident in Wales, or Irish citizens or EU citizens with settled
 status or indefinite leave to remain in the UK who normally reside in Wales, may be eligible for
 Postgraduate Master's funding in the form of a loan. The amount of funding available per student
 is based on household income. Full details of support can be found on the <u>Student Finance Wales</u>
 website.
- Student Finance Northern Ireland: UK or Irish citizens or EU citizens with settled status or
 indefinite leave to remain in the UK who normally reside in Northern Ireland or the UK may be
 eligible for a Tuition Fee loan. You will also need to live in Northern Ireland on or before the first
 day of the academic year of the course. Full details of support can be found on the <u>Student</u>

International Students

Students from non-UK countries are welcome to apply – the course is aimed at students from all over the world. The SALTIRE scholarship programme is funded by the Scottish Government in collaboration with Scottish universities and colleges. The awards offer £8,000 towards tuition fees for one year, full time study on master degree courses at Scottish higher education institutions. Citizens of Canada,

China (including Hong Kong), India, Japan, Pakistan and USA are eligible to apply for awards under this programme.

- British Council Chevening scholarships: Chevening scholarships are funded by the Foreign and Commonwealth Office (FCO) to enable students to pursue one-year master degree courses in the UK in any academic field of study. These are fully funded scholarships which will meet the cost of tuitions, living expenses, and return flights to the UK.

- Commonwealth Master's Scholarship are funded by the Commonwealth Scholarship Commission to enable students to study in the UK who would not otherwise be able to afford to undertake full-time postgraduate study, including Master's degrees.

- **GREAT Scholarships** are available to students from selected countries and cover tuition fees, a living allowance and travel costs. The call for scholarship applications usually opens in January each year.

- Society for Underwater Technology (SUT): The Society for Underwater Technology offers sponsorship awards to postgraduate students taking one-year taught MSc courses. An award of up to £4,000 is available for taught postgraduate students who have obtained an undergraduate degree in a relevant engineering or science subject. Awards are available to any student irrespective of age or nationality.

 Marshall Scholarships: Marshall scholarships offer funding for young American graduates to study at a UK university for one-year master degree courses. Scholarships cover tuition fees, living expenses, research costs and travel to and from America. http://www.marshallscholarship.org/

Asia

- The Inlaks Foundation: The Inlaks Foundation offers funding for postgraduate study abroad and are available to Indian nationals who have a first degree from a recognised university in India. www.inlaksfoundation.org
- Tata Education Trust: Under the JN Tata Endowment scheme, the trust provides loans to Indian
 nationals who are pursuing postgraduate study abroad, including master degrees. Only
 students who have graduated from an Indian university are eligible to apply.

We would therefore encourage you to check the funder's website for details about when calls for scholarship or grant applications open and close. In most cases, you will have to receive an offer of a place on the course before you are eligible to apply for any scholarship. SAMS and UHI are not able to coordinate applications for scholarships.
