Learning Outcomes

LO1. Demonstrate a critical understanding of clinical examination, assessment and management of common minor injuries.

LO2. Evidence knowledge of the anatomy, physiology and pathology to underpin the immediate assessment and management of minor injuries.

LO3. Provide a critical evaluation and synthesis of models and approaches for assessment and management of common minor injuries.

LO4. Demonstrate application of knowledge and critical understanding of active processes of clinical reasoning, judgement and decision making related to minor injury management.

LO5. Critically analyse and evaluate the theory and interpretation of evidence base practice related to minor injury management.

Mode of study:

Part time (Structured): A blended approach will be adopted for Teaching and Learning using Brightspace, the university's virtual learning environment (VLE), along with two face-to-face sessions for interactive learning on campus adopting video conferencing technology to enhance learning experiences.
