Learning Outcomes

- Demonstrate a critical understanding of clinical examination, assessment and management of common minor injuries.
- Evidence knowledge of the anatomy, physiology and pathology to underpin the immediate assessment and management of minor injuries.
- Provide a critical evaluation and synthesis of models and approaches for assessment and management of common minor injuries with a focus on shared decision making and personcentred care
- Demonstrate application of knowledge and critical understanding of active processes of clinical reasoning, judgement and decision making related to minor injury management.
- Critically analyse and evaluate the theory and interpretation of evidence base practice related to person-centred minor injury management

Mode of Study

Part-time (structured). A blended approach is adopted for teaching and learning using the university VLE along with two face-to-face/VC sessions for interactive learning on campus, adopting video conferencing technology to enhance learning experiences.
