**Learning Outcomes**

- Undertake independent systematic clinical histories and assessments inclusive of relevant mental health assessments of relevant patient groups.
- Critically apply in depth knowledge of clinical sciences to patient assessments in order to select/conduct/initiate appropriate diagnostic procedures.
- Synthesise clinical data obtained from clinical histories, assessments and diagnostic procedures to inform appropriate clinical decision making.
- Critically differentiate common pathologies utilising appropriate clinical information.
- Demonstrate competence with sound rationale for referrals within a multidisciplinary team.
- Demonstrate critical awareness of ethical, legal and professional issues and the application of relevant frameworks related to advanced practice.

**Mode of Study**

Part-time (Structured): This module is studied through supported online learning via the university's virtual learning environment (VLE) with 10 face-to-face days and one further day for OSCEs.
