Learning outcomes

- Demonstrate an enhanced level of understanding of multi-morbidity and contextualise this within their own context of practice.
- Evaluate the impact of multi-morbidity on the individual, their family and the health and social care systems and apply this knowledge to understand approaches to assessment, monitoring and outcomes in multi-morbidity.
- Critically evaluate the impact of inter-personal and inter-professional communication practices to support person centred care of individuals with multi-morbidity.
- Critically appraise strategies to support the management and the complexities of care of individuals with multi-morbidity and apply this knowledge to a clinical practice setting.
- Critically reflect on approaches to realising effective care in multi-morbidity within diverse populations to achieve optimal outcomes in care, including application of systems thinking, public health care and palliative care approaches.

Mode of study

Part-time (Structured): A blended approach will be adopted for teaching and learning using the university's virtual learning environment (VLE), along with two half-day sessions (2 x 3hrs) of interactive learning via video conferencing.

Timing of video conferencing learning days

Day 2: Week 11

Assessment

There are two assessments. First, students are required to make an active and meaningful contribution to discussion board participation during the module (10%). Second, a written case study (4,000 words) is required for submission during week 13 of the module.
