

### CAA: based on Participatory Action Research

- Intergenerational community-driven research: creative social pedagogies
- Handing the power over to participants as experts in their own lives in design, co-designing methods of inquiry, analysis and action planning
- Co-ownership and co-construction of research, departure of separation of researcher and researched - researchers are facilitators rather than extracting data
- Multiple voices heard in communities research as a political value driven process
- Dialogic method of inquiry potential to be transformative it is central to understand changing context, relationships and power dynamics in communities and decision-making processes
- Prevailing norms, attitudes and behaviours are critically questioned in deliberations about future paths

CAA was developed as a form of Participatory Action Research to work on issues that are important to people in local communities and to social services.










