## **Programme Information**

Developed in partnership with expert clinical partners, and taught by subject experts, these programmes will equip nurses, midwives and allied health professionals to lead and deliver advanced healthcare for their client groups.

To qualify as an advanced nurse practitioner the following 3 modules are core to the programme :

- <u>Clinical reasoning, judgement and decision-making</u>
- Non-medical prescribing (NMP)
- <u>Clinical assessment for advanced practice</u>

The programme also includes a range of other modules including :

- Risk, vulnerability and incapacity: legal and ethical frameworks for professional practice
- <u>Expertise in dementia practice</u>
- <u>Professional leadership and resilience</u>

- <u>Understanding research in evidence-based practice</u>
