Programme Informaon

Developed in partnership with expert clinical partners, and taught by subject experts, these programmes will equip nurses, midwives and allied health professionals to lead and deliver advanced healthcare for their client groups.

To qualify as an advanced nurse praconer the $f\quad$ ollowing 3 modules are core to the programme :

- Clinical reasoning, judgement and decision-making
- Non-medical prescribing (NMP)
- Clinical assessment for advanced pracce

The modules can also be undertaken as standalone. Further informaon about the programme.

- Assessing Incapacity: legal and ethical frameworks for professional pracce
- Experse in demena pr acce

- Professional leadership and resilience
- Improvement science: enhancing quality in health and social care

"This programme is supporng our woorkforce development and service needs. I think that it is important for nurses working in remote and rural areas to have access to educaonal support which meets and is co-designed with their unique context of pracce in mind.
The advanced pracce r ole of remote and rural nurses requires a different approach to healthcare delivery.

In order to address the challenges of rapidly changing health and social care delivery and societal changes nurses are taking on new responsibilies with wider spher es of influence than ever and it is crucial that our populaon has the nur ses it deserves and needs."



Student Blog

In this edion, we hear from Lorraine Matheson about her experience of undertaking the ANP programme and in parcular the Comple xies of c are in mul-morbidity module, led by Clare Carolan. Lorraine has sent us this from Colombia and included some pictures of her cycle touring!

"I have completed the Clinical Decision Making module followed by the Care and Complexies in Mulmorbidity a t MSC level which has significantly improved my pracce.

I now consider elements such as human factors and the many "biases" that influence my decision making and to counteract this I use a "debiasing tool" to help me rule out the worst case scenario

The Care and Complexies in Mulmorbidity has been r eally helpful as the majority of paen ts I see have mulmorbidity and it 's so relevant to all praconer s in both primary and secondary care. I've learned so much from it! I now try to be more holisc and discuss "opons" with the pa en ts and consider the "burden of treatment" for the individual paen t as well as polypharmacy.

The way it was delivered was really interacy e which helped me absorb the material on a weekly basis. It also inspired me not only to change my clinical pracce but $t \,$ o look at system change. I can't recommend this module enough!

In addion I' ve completed the Recognised Prior Learning process for NMP and Clinical assessment for advanced pracce (CAAP) t o achieve the Postgraduate Diploma in Advanced Pracce which I'm delighted about."
