#### This privacy statement relates to the following purposes:

The GOC, your placement provider, and UHI all have responsibilities under the Health and Safety at Work Act 1974, RIDDOR Regulations, and GOC regulations / Optician's Act 1989. These obligations set out a range of requirements for all parties to keep you, and others, safe and to ensure placements are carried out with due academic and practice standards. Any personal data that is necessary for any of these purpose will, or may, be process and/or shared with any other relevant body.

Purpose 1: Occupational Health Service for Optometry Students  Purpose 2: Optometry placements administration	Optometry students are required to undertake occupational health assessments to make sure they can safely undertake the course and interact with patients. This is a requirement of Health and Safety law and a recommendation of the General Optical Council (GOC) designed to keep you and patients safe and well.  The Optometry course includes compulsory work placements. Your data will be used to administer your placements with your placement organisations; such as independent and multiple optician practices, hospital eye services, NHS Education for Scotland, NHS boards. In your fifth year placements may be administered by NHS Education for Scotland.
Purpose 3: General Optical Council Registration	It is a condition of the GOC that students studying Optometry and Independent Prescribing register as a student with the GOC at all times. Your data may be shared with the GOC for this purpose, including verifying your registration and sharing relevant information as required by the conditions of your registration. You can read more about the conditions of your GOC registration, including potential data sharing, at the GOC website.
Purpose 4: Funding administration	Optometry students often receive funding from SAAS, or other funding bodies (eg Student Loans Company), for their course. If you receive funding from SAAS, or another funding body, your data will, or may, be shared with SAAS, or the other funding body, in keeping with your funding agreement.
Purpose 5: Progress reports to funding bodies	Students supported and funded by private or NHS organisations or funding bodies will normally have some, or all, of their course fees paid by their funders. If your fees are paid by a funder, your data, including course progress, will, or may, be shared with the funder in keeping with your funding agreement.

Purpose 6: Provision of uniform	Optometry students are required to wear appropriate uniforms during their placements and in patient/volunteer clinics. UHI will process your data to arrange uniforms for you on placements, the data will include your name and uniform size.
