






## The Clothing Crisis

- Returned goods and terminal (end-of-line) retail stock costs clothing retailers in excess of £60bn per year
- Most is stored in costly warehouses before being destroyed by landfill, incineration or shredding
- Retailers are actively looking for ways to shift stock through warehouses without devaluing their brand

ALICAS created tailored capsule clothing parcels for women in clothing crisis, using repurposed retail stock.




## Referrals From Public Bodies + Charities

As many of you know ALICAS' funding stopped in June of this year. We were so fortunate to have had 12 whole months fully funded and tried everything we could to fill the gap.

Generous donations came via our Go Fund Me and allowed us to continue sending parcels (reaching 73 in total). Unfortunately that money was quickly allocated and left us with no remaining funds to cover the costs of postage and packaging for subsequent referrals.

We have been thrilled to be able to support pop up shops for female Syrian refugees with our donations - bringing the total number of women supported by the project to 80. None of this would have been possible without your incredible support. So what now?.

As many founders know the start-up journey is never straightforward, requiring you to be resilient and resourceful. This resourcefulness has seen ALICAS extend its reach to nu coton-working with brands that want to market themselves ethically and advocating for responsible, mission-led business everywhere, as well as supporting young women in activism through a series of workshops

While we build the financially sustainable part of our business we are sadly unable to take your generous donations or fulfil referrals. Our remaining stock is being put to good use through our pop-up shops and every single garment will get to a woman who needs it. . If you do have tags-on clothing, please offer them to your local Women's Aid.

Our aim for the future is to build financial sustainability so that we can continue our social mission, and until then we hope you will stay with us on this magical journey  $\Rightarrow$
