

Guidance for students about resit requirements in Summer 2021

For undergraduate degree students in Year 3 and Year 4, and for taught postgraduate programmes

If there are any modules you have not yet passed, you will be expected to resit these during the summer. This applies to Semester 2 modules AND any modules outstanding from Semester 1. Contact your Personal Academic Tutor (PAT) or Programme Leader as soon as possible to discuss your reassessment requirements, including online exam date or submission deadline. Remember, if you are unable to submit assessments in the summer, you must submit a new mitigating circumstances claim online.

For undergraduate degree students in Year 1 and Year 2

To support students impacted by the COVID pandemic, the university is operating some exceptional assessment arrangements during the current year. This is known as our [fair assessment approach](#)

You will be eligible for up to 40 credits as 'Ungraded Credits' (UC) for modules you have not completed, provided you have met the achievement threshold:

- pass all modules which are designated as "core for progression" on the course and
- pass 80 credits at relevant level

You do not have to complete reassessments for modules where Ungraded Credit has been awarded, although you can choose to do so, to receive a mark and grade.

You WILL need to undertake reassessments for modules designated as "core for progression". Your course leader will advise which modules this applies to on your course (if any).

Courses accredited by professional, statutory or regulatory bodies may have specific requirements which exclude the use of Ungraded Credit. Your course leader will advise if this applies to your course.

Ungraded credits will be awarded in early July and will then show on your student record. But you will need to know as early as possible whether or not you have to do resits, and you can work this out from your profile of results. To view your results, click on **Student Hub>Modules>Module Results Tab**.

You will need to pass all outstanding modules if you wish to exit with an intermediate award, rather than progress to the next year of your studies.

Full-time students

I have passed 4 modules (80 credits) this year – do I need to do resits in the summer?

I have passed 5 modules (100 credits) this year – do I need to do resits in the summer?

You WILL need to undertake reassessments for any modules designated as "core for progression". Your course leader will advise which modules this applies to on your course (if any).

Otherwise, you do not need to undertake reassessments – you will be permitted to progress to the next year of your studies in September 2021.

You have the OPTION to undertake reassessments over the summer if you want to benefit from this learning experience. If you pass, you will receive a mark and grade for the module as normal, which will show on your student record instead of 'Ungraded Credits' (UC). If you attempt and fail, the Ungraded Credits will remain, and you will still be permitted to progress.

I have passed 3 modules (60 credits) this year – do I need to do resits in the summer?

YES

You will need to undertake reassessments and pass AT LEAST one module, to meet the threshold for progression, which is minimum of 80 credits. It may be advisable to undertake reassessments for more than one module.

AND

You will need to undertake reassessments for any modules designated as “core for progression”.

Your course leader will advise which modules this applies to on your course (if any).

You should contact your Personal Academic Tutor (PAT) or Programme Leader as soon as possible to discuss your situation.

Remember, if you are unable to submit assessments in the summer, you must submit a new mitigating circumstances claim online. However, you will not be able to progress if you have not met the threshold for progression.

I have passed 2 modules (40 credits) this year – do I need to do resits in the summer?

YES

You will need to undertake reassessments and pass AT LEAST two modules, to meet the threshold for progression, which is minimum of 80 credits. It may be advisable to undertake reassessments for more than two modules.

AND

You will need to undertake reassessments for any modules designated as “core for progression”.

Your course leader will advise which modules this applies to on your course (if any).

You should contact your Personal Academic Tutor (PAT) or Programme Leader as soon as possible to discuss your situation.

Remember, if you are unable to submit assessments in the summer, you must submit a new mitigating circumstances claim online. However, you will not be able to progress if you have not met the threshold for progression.

I have passed 0-1 modules (0-20 credits) this year – what should I do?

You will need to undertake reassessments and/or repeat modules before you can progress. This would be a significant workload to achieve over the summer.

You should contact your Personal Academic Tutor (PAT) or Programme Leader as soon as possible to discuss your situation, including the possibility of a repeat year.

Part-time students

I have passed 1-2 modules (20-40 credits) this year, but did not pass others. Overall I have 80 credits (or more) at my current level. Do I need to do resits in the summer?

You WILL need to undertake reassessments for any modules designated as “core for progression”.

Your course leader will advise which modules this applies to on your course (if any).

Otherwise, you do not need to undertake reassessments – you will be permitted to progress to the next year of your studies in September 2021.

You have the OPTION to undertake reassessments over the summer if you want to benefit from this learning experience. If you pass, you will receive a mark and grade for the module as normal, which will show on your student record instead of ‘Ungraded Credits’ (UC). If you attempt and fail, the Ungraded Credits will remain, and you will still be permitted to progress.

There are some modules I have not yet passed this year. Overall, I have 60 credits (or less) at my current level. Do I need to do resits in the summer?

YES

You will need to undertake reassessments for the modules you have not yet passed. You will not be eligible for Ungraded Credits this year.

You should contact your Personal Academic Tutor (PAT) or Programme Leader as soon as possible to discuss your situation.

Remember, if you are unable to submit assessments in the summer, you must submit a new mitigating circumstances claim online. However, you will not be able to progress if you have not met the threshold for progression.
