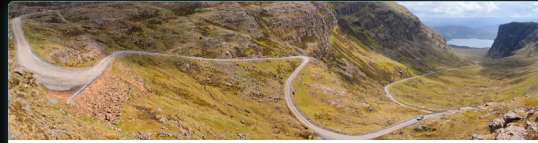
Achmelvich beach - an exquisitely stunning beach neighboring a campsite

Durness beach and Smoo cave - where you can explore the cave by boat



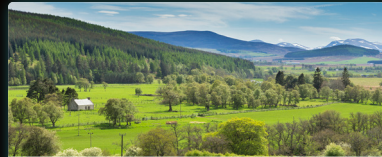
The Applecross Inn - offers "spectacular views and fine food". The road to get there, the Bealach na Bà, is named "toughest climb" by Cyclist magazine

Isle of Skye - Fairy pools



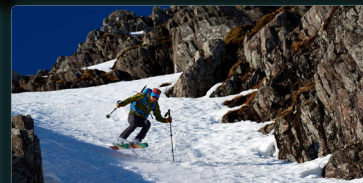
Isle of Skye - Old Man of Storr
