Pupils can apply for an HNC or HND directly to us if they are not applying through UCAS to other institutions. Where this is the case, their University of the Highlands and Islands HNC or HND application should be included as one of their UCAS choices.

Our admissions team will aim to make a decision or interview notification by the end of March for applications received by the 15 January deadline.
